- First-come, first-served policy; reservations can be made on group sites only
- Check-out time: 12:00 pm
- Quiet time begins at 10:00 pm

## Pets

- Pets must be kept on a leash and are not allowed in the concession area
- Do not leave your pet unattended
- Please clean up after your pet

## Fires

- Please use extreme caution
- Fires are permitted only in the fire pits provided
- Do not move fire pits
- Do not leave fires unattended
- Please follow fire ban regulations

## Attractions around Shelter Point Park:

- Gillies Bay
  - Restaurant, tennis court, and a farmer's market on Sundays from 12:30 – 2:30 pm in the summer.
- Texada Golf Course (Crescent Bay Road): 20 minute drive from Shelter Point
- Additional hiking and mountain biking trails – see the fold-out map in the Texada Island brochure.
- Additional swimming spots
  - Shingle Beach: 30-mins south of Gillies Bay via well-maintained gravel road
  - Heisholt Lake (The Quarries): Turquoise-blue waters fill an abandoned mine. 5-minute drive from the Blubber Bay ferry, 20-minute drive from Shelter Point

## Directions

- Take the Texada ferry from Westview in Powell River to Blubber Bay (35 mins)
- Follow Blubber Bay Road until Van Anda and take a right onto Gillies Bay Road
- Drive about 20 minutes until you reach the park.

## Facilities

- 52 individual RV and tent sites
- 2 group sites
- Food concession
- Drinking water
- Flush toilets
- Showers
- Sani-station
- Firewood sales
- 2 boat ramps
- Playground
- Picnic benches

## Rates

### Main campground

- Individual sites:
  - \$21 per unit per night (\$19 for seniors) – April 1 – October 15
  - \$16 per unit per night (\$14 for seniors) – October 16 – March 31
- Group sites:
  - \$185 per site per night for groups of up to 10 camper units; \$15 per night for each additional camper unit
- Showers: \$2
- Firewood: \$6/level wagon load

### Bella Maria Campground

- Individual sites have the same rates as the main campground
- Group sites:
  - \$130 per site per night for groups of up to 7 camper units; \$15 per night for each additional camper unit

## Recreational Opportunities at Shelter Point Park

### Swimming

Shelter Point Park offers a 2 km stretch of beachfront ideal for swimming. The beach by the concession has a designated swimming area.

### Trails

A nature trail along the forested shoreline near Shelter Point can be accessed just up the hill from the main campsite. The trail houses some large trees and is a great example of some B.C. forest.



### Wildlife viewing

Deer, birds, and many other forms of wildlife abound on Texada. For bird-watching enthusiasts, as many as 265 bird species can be found on Texada, including herons, eagles, loons, osprey, harlequins, cormorants, and scooters. Since Texada lacks any cougars or bears, you can enjoy wildlife viewing and camping without any dangers!

### Fishing, Boating and Hunting

Shelter Point Park offers a boat launch area. Fishing requires a valid license.

Proper licenses are required for hunting. Carcasses must be hunted out of sight or covered with a tarp.

### Shellfish gathering

Shelter Point's beachfront provides a great beachcombing and shellfish collecting area. A proper license is required for collecting shellfish. Please return clam and oyster shells to the beach in order to keep shellfish beds growing!
